


Experiencing God Bible Study Begins Wednesday, June 1 at 6:00pm in the Conference Room

Anglican Diocese of the Southwest School of Ministry

Are you ready to grow in the Lord and be better equipped for ministry?

The Anglican Diocese of the Southwest School of Ministry (ADSWSM) is a certificate program for second career professionals who are interested in becoming a deacon and dedicated lay personnel who want a deeper understanding of faith and ministry in the Anglican tradition. Participation in the program *does not automatically place a person on an ordination track.* This distance program *may* satisfy certain educational requirements for those interested in a non-traditional, non-credit program route to ordination in the Anglican Diocese of the Southwest. Classes will be offered through Zoom sessions. Participation in this two year, four semester program will approximate a 36-hour Master of Arts degree. Students who finish the 12 courses in the program will be awarded a Certificate in Anglican Ministry from the ADSWSM under the certification of the Bishop.

Presently, the instructor/facilitator for the classes will be Fr. Hal Scott, Rector of the Anglican Church of the Good Shepherd in San Angelo, TX. Hal has earned his BA in Organizational Development from Southwest Texas State University (now Texas State-San Marcos); Master of Divinity, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; Doctor of Philosophy in Theology (New Testament), Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; Master of Business Administration, Trident University International; Graduate Diploma from the Naval War College Command and Staff Program; a Graduate Certificate of Studies in Operational Planning from the Joint and Combined Warfighting School, National Defense University; and Certificate of Anglican Studies from the Jurisdiction of Armed Forces and Chaplaincy. Hal is a retired Navy Commander in the USN Chaplain Corps where he held subspecialty codes in resource management, ethics, and pastoral care. Additionally, Hal is a Board Certified Clinical Chaplain with the National Association of VA Chaplains and a Pastor Care Specialists with the ACPE. He completed four units of Clinical Pastoral Education, certified by the ACPE, at the Naval Hospital, Portsmouth VA. Prior to accepting his parish in San Angelo, Hal was the Provost of the Jurisdiction of Armed Forces and Chaplaincy, with approximately 200 endorsed chaplains.

Other instructors/facilitators may be added as they become available.

The following courses will be offered:

Fall 2022 New Testament Systematic Theology Church History Spring 2023 Old Testament Biblical Interpretation Biblical Ethics

Fall 2023 Pastoral Theology/Care Evangelism and Missions Preaching/Homiletics Spring 2024 Anglican History Anglican Theology BOCP and Liturgy

Different classes will be offered Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday nights—each meeting for 90 minutes at 8PM CST. Each class will require will require from 50-100 pages to be read each week and students will be required to submit a one page, double spaced reflection page on an assigned question for each course per week. No tests will be given; however, classroom participation in discussions will be required. At the end of each course, students will be assigned a grade of either Pass or Incomplete. Textbooks are chosen that are readily available through Amazon and noted for their clarity in expression and utility in ministry.

No enrollment or tuition will be assessed for this program, but students are required to obtain their own textbooks. Enrollment begins July 15 and closes August 15. Email Hal at anglican.sm@gmail.com for an enrollment form. The Fall Semester begins September 5-7, 2022 and the last sessions are between December 12-14, 2022.

HAPPINESS AND PRAYER

Introduction by Jean Stinnett

In January I polled my happiest friends asking the question, "Is happiness a choice?" My friend and long-time prayer partner, Rolly Dunteman, responded a resounding YES in prose bordering on poetry. She calls herself my "amiga de regular," a colloquial Spanish term of endearment. If you know Rolly you can almost hear her voice in her answer below.

For those of you who do not know her, Rolly has been a member of the Anglican Church of the Good Shepherd for many years. While raising their family of six children in the 1990s Rolly and Jay split their time between Costa Rica and San Angelo. Health constraints sent them to live in Costa Rica in 2018 with daughter and son-in-law, Judith Dunteman and Alexcey Murillo, both MDs ministering to aboriginal Cabecar Indians on a reservation in the mountains of Costa Rica. The doctors' mission field, the Emmanuel Development Center, was our congregation ministry partner at one time. They live in a compound and support indigenous people in entrepreneurial positions to make them more self-sufficient. Located near the Dunteman/Murillo home is one such business—a restaurant available for travelers, researchers, and locals which provides daily meals to the Duntemans.

Rolly's environment is rural, agricultural, tropical and sparsely populated. Food is grown locally, supplemented with their own chickens. The national language is Spanish but native Indians speak a separate tongue. There are few modernized creature comforts, yet the beauty of God's creation surrounds them.

Jay and Rolly celebrated their 65th anniversary on New Year's Eve. Jay turned 90 in January. Rolly will be 87 on June 28. Their golden years are full of memories. And in the midst of it all they continually thank God for their blessings. Take a walk with Rolly as she explains happiness in her own words.

In MY special case right now, I have made a choice to be content and happy. I hardly ever, ever leave the premises here. I see only a few busy family members and can barely hear any more. I have hearing aids but still have difficulty hearing. I get to a store such as a small Walmart maybe three times a year. I have no church nearby and seldom converse in English except when my children visit or call on the phone. I miss weddings, graduations, new babies born and family gatherings. I haven't met my youngest great-granddaughter but hope to by the end of the year.

BUT I can walk!

On my daily routine, I check to see if the chickens are OK. We lost two recently, one to a coyote and another to an opossum. After checking the chickens I count bunches of bananas that I see and bless those banana trees. I walk down the driveway and count all the pineapple plants producing my daily intake of the sweetest fruit I have ever tasted. I give a wave to the ladies in the restaurant as I walk the circumference of the parking lot, then climb the hill to the first lookout point. I stop, pray, and enjoy the beauty that surrounds me. From that lookout point I walk to the next lookout point and sit on a bench petting the little dog the Lord brought to me out of the blue. Ozzie is polite and the best mannered dog I have ever encountered. I am thankful he found me. I am NOT a dog lover: four of my children have suffered dog bites!

Ozzie found his way to us via the restaurant and is a real special blessing to me. With three large outside watch dogs in residence, I was not interested in having another dog around. He seems to be mostly cocker spaniel, black with a little white on his chest and more on his stomach. My grandson, Ari, brought him home and named him Ozzie. With the few people out here everyone knows everyone AND their dogs, so we have to think he was abandoned.

Anyway, the Lord brought me a wonderful pet. Darling little Ozzie accompanies me on all my daily walks without a leash. He is polite in that he is not a barker. He never attempts to get on the furniture. He has manners in that he doesn't jump on anyone or beg at the table. During meals we find him lying at my feet. Horses don't spook him nor he the horses.

This is the second pet the Lord has brought to cheer me on. The first was a cat I call Shadow, and she is darling, too. Shadow spends most of her days sleeping inside the house. But if I sit in a special chair she jumps on my lap and snuggles, working her paws (cat lovers know what I mean). The cat and dog keep their distance from each other but there is no wrangling between them either.

Leaving the second lookout point I stop in the restaurant for a quick "Hello" and proceed back to the house. The three big watch dogs (tied up in daytime while the restaurant is open) bark at Ozzie. I tell them to be nice and we go on.

At the house I check on Jay. I put my ear close to his mouth to figure out what he is saying. If it weren't for the three Christian men helping Jay 24/7 he would need to be in a nursing home. Jay asks me if I ever thought I'd be married to an old man. I tell him I never thought I'd live this long! Many days he is not content and wants to go back to our condo in town or back to San Angelo. So we count our blessings until he admits, that yes, we are in the best place for us at this time in our lives. So when Jay is happy, I'm happy.

The Lord has truly and greatly blessed us all our lives. What I love best about my family is that all my children and grandchildren love the Lord. There is harmony among us and we pray for one another. They take turns coming to see us each year. I'm the happiest when my children and grandchildren visit and take the time to share their lives and dreams with us. Last year the three oldest Coors children were baptized in the river by the mission. We cried with joy and thanksgiving that afternoon. I'm tearing up right now remembering.

Joining the Anglican Church of the Good Shepherd intercessory prayer group brought me much closer to the depth and understanding of appreciating the Lord's hand on my life and many others. I saw members of the congregation as true brothers and sisters in the Lord. My compassion in prayer was so often met with knowing we cared for each other. But the Lord was the one touching and strengthening our hearts as well as answering prayers, healing, comforting, and encouraging others. Thank you, Jesus, for getting me started in the prayer group. How I miss gathering now! But He is faithful to hear us even as we are scattered.

Sometimes happiness is just there surrounding us. Other times we purposely choose it. God is in it, either way.
